

BIRDS OF PREY (New Series)

DH 1428 SNOW OWL PLUS
DH 1549 SMALL SNOW OWL

Materials Needed: Greenware, Various Brushes, Diamond Dust, Soft Cloth.
Colors By Doc Holliday: DH-29 White, DH-8 Black, DH-18 Medium Brown, DH-9 Real Brown, DH-10 Mustard, SP4 Snow-It & Matte Sealer.

- Step 1:** Clean greenware carefully and fire to Cone 03.
Step 2: Basecoat entire piece, except for free trunk with White. Basecoat trunk Black.
Step 3: Drybrush trunk with Real Brown. Highlight trunk with Medium Brown.
Step 4: Using a Medium Brown wash, corner load a 1/2" shader brush and shade each wing section, around eyes and around tail feathers. Make small slashes on each feather using a Medium Brown wash. (Refer to flyer.)
Step 5: Eyes are Mustard with Black pupils. Beak is painted Real Brown. Spray with Matte Spray Sealer.
Step 6: Apply Snow-It to base and sprinkle on Diamond Dust.

DH 1429 RED-TAILED HAWK PLUS
DH 1550 SMALL RED-TAILED HAWK

Materials Needed: Greenware, Various Brushes, Diamond Dust, Soft Cloth.
Colors By Doc Holliday: DH-8 Black, DH-29 White, DH-9 Real Brown, DH-12 Leather Brown, DH-18 Medium Brown, DH-19 Light Grey, DH-21 Sand, DH-25 Toast, DH-30 Country Blue, DH-37 Cream, DH-38 Grass Green, DH-45 Shadow Green, DH-10 Mustard.

- Step 1:** Clean greenware and fire to Cone 05.
Step 2: Basecoat front of bird with Cream. Apply a very thin wash of Toast over the Cream, allowing it to puddle in the crevices. Drybrush over the Toast with Cream (several coats). Highlight edges and tips of feathers by drybrushing with White. Shade along main feathers with a thin Black wash. Shade ends of largest feathers with a Black wash. Paint "bars" on feathers with Medium Brown. Shade upper chest feathers and base of wings near shoulders with a Toast wash. Paint vertical lines on upper chest with Medium Brown. Paint horizontal lines on lower chest, around legs with Real Brown. Shade toes and feet with a Medium Brown wash.
Step 3: Basecoat all remaining areas Black. Lighten the beak by drybrushing with Black mixed with White. Drybrush log and all remaining feathers with Real Brown; highlight feathers except tail with Toast. Drybrush tail with Leather Brown, then highlight feathers near body with Toast, very lightly with Mustard. Shade lower edges of feather rows with a Black wash. Paint bars on wing feathers with a Black wash. Paint one row of Black bars on lower edge of tail feathers. Drybrush ends of tail feathers with Cream. Randomly highlight same wing feathers with Cream. Using a heavy Black wash, line along each feather to define and separate. Paint a few White feathers around face and eyes. Paint eyes Mustard; shade with a Toast wash. Paint the pupil Black.
Step 4: Highlight log with Medium Brown, then Sand, then Cream on highest edges. Drybrush barkless areas of log with Sand. Shade these areas with washes of Toast, Real Brown and Black. Drybrush rocks Light Grey. Shade them with washes of Toast, Country Blue, and Leather Brown. Drybrush grass and leaves Grass Green. Add Mustard to the Grass Green and highlight edges of grass and leaves. Shade centers of leaves with Shadow Green, then Black. Shade around leaves, rocks and crevices in log with a Black wash. Lightly drybrush the rocks with Cream.
Step 5: Spray with Matte Spray Sealer.

DH 1430 BALD EAGLE

Materials Needed: Greenware, Various Brushes, Soft Cloth.
Colors By Doc Holliday: DH-8 Black, DH-9 Real Brown, DH-25 Toast, DH-12 Leather Brown, DH-18 Medium Brown, DH-42 Dark Grey, DH-19 Light Grey, DH-29 White, DH-30 Country Blue, DH-2 Butter Cream, DH-10 Mustard, DH-37 Cream, Matte Spray Sealer.

- Step 1:** Carefully clean greenware and fire to Cone 03.
Step 2: Basecoat entire piece with Black.
Step 3: Drybrush eagle and tree trunk with Real Brown, Drybrush body and top of wing feathers with Toast. Without rinsing your brush, add some Leather Brown and highlight these areas again.
Step 4: Drybrush last three rows of wing feathers with Leather Brown. Drybrush head and tail feathers White.
Step 5: Drybrush tree trunk with Medium Brown and Dark Grey mix. Drybrush rocks with Light Grey. Apply washes of Toast, Real Brown and Country Blue to rocks, highlight edges with Cream.
Step 6: Drybrush beak and feet with Butter Cream. Highlight with a wash of Mustard. Eyes are Butter Cream with Black pupil.

Step 7: Corner load a 1/2" shader brush with Black and shade around head feathers, wings and crevices on rocks. Shade tail feathers with Toast. Paint toe nails Black. Spray with Matte Spray Sealer.

DH 1320 EAGLE WITH CHICK

Materials Needed: Greenware, Brushes, Cleaning Tools, Matte Spray Sealer.
Colors By Doc Holliday: DH-8 Black, DH-29 White, DH-37 Cream, DH-9 Real Brown, DH-25 Toast, DH-12 Leather Brown, DH-10 Mustard, DH-18 Medium Brown.

- Step 1:** Clean greenware and fire to cone 03.
Step 2: Basecoat entire piece with Black.
Step 3: Drybrush entire piece with Real Brown.
Step 4: Drybrush Chick with Buttermilk and lightly highlight with a Sable Brown wash.
Step 5: Drybrush large Eagle with Henna and then with Sandalwood (except for head and tail feathers).
Step 6: Drybrush head & tail feathers with Buttermilk and then White.
Step 7: Drybrush feet and beaks with Inca Gold and shade with a Sandalwood wash.
Step 8: Drybrush branches with Sable Brown, lighten the Sable Brown with a little Buttermilk and highlight branches.
Step 9: Shade tips of feathers on Eagle with Black wash. Using a liner brush, outline feathers with Black wash.
Step 10: Eyes are Inca Gold with a Sandalwood wash. Pupils are Black.
Step 11: Spray with Matte Spray Sealer.

DH 1547 SMALL EAGLE IN FLIGHT

Doc Holliday Colors: Black, Red Brown, Sandalwood, Henna, Soft Grey, Buttermilk, White, Sable, Suman, Inca Gold, Heather Blue, Charcoal Grey, Matte Spray Sealer.

- Step 1:** Clean greenware carefully. Fire to Cone 03.
Step 2: Basecoat entire piece Black.
Step 3: Drybrush eagle, free trunk and roots with Red Brown.
Step 4: Drybrush top 3 rows of feathers and body with Sandalwood. Without rinsing your brush, add a little Henna and go over the Sandalwood to highlight. Drybrush last row of feathers with Henna.
Step 5: Drybrush tail and head feathers with Buttermilk and then with White.
Step 6: Drybrush beak and feet with Inca Gold. Go over these parts again, using a Sandalwood wash. Corner load a shader brush with Red Brown and shade around beak.
Step 7: Drybrush smooth part of tree trunk with Suman and then use a wash of Sandalwood and Red Brown to shade the trunk.
Step 8: Drybrush the rest of the tree trunk and roots with Sable Brown. Drybrush again with Sable mixed with a little Buttermilk to highlight. Shade trunk with a Red Brown wash. Highlight tree trunk and roots lightly with Charcoal Grey.
Step 9: Drybrush all rocks area with Soft Grey. Apply washes of Sandalwood, Red Brown and Heather Blue to rocks randomly. Highlight rocks with Buttermilk.
Step 10: Eyes are Inca Gold with a Sandalwood wash. Pupil is Black with White highlight.
Step 11: Corner load a shader brush with Black and shade feathers and rock area and around tree trunk. Spray with Matte Spray Sealer.

DH 1548 SMALL FISHING EAGLE

Doc Holliday Colors: DH8 Black, DH9 Real Brown, DH10 Mustard, DH25 Toast, DH27 Midnight Blue, DH29 White, DH30 Country Blue, DH38 Grass Green.

- Step 1:** Basecoat entire piece Black.
Step 2: Drybrush eagle with Real Brown. Add Toast to your brush and lightly drybrush again except last section of wing feathers.
Step 3: Drybrush White on eagle's head, tail feathers and lightly between feathers on wings.
Step 4: Drybrush Mustard on beak and claws. Paint eyes Mustard with a wash of Toast and Black pupils.
Step 5: Shade beak and claws with a Toast wash then use Black. Shade eagle's feathers with a Black wash.
Step 6: Drybrush fish with Grass Green, then lightly with Mustard. Add White to your brush and drybrush top half of fish and fins. Shade fish with a Black wash.
Step 7: Drybrush water Midnight Blue, then add Country Blue to brush to highlight. Use White to highlight water more.
Step 8: Spray lightly with a Matte Sealer.

DH 1546 PEREGRINE FALCON

Materials Needed: Greenware, Various Brushes, Cleaning Tools & Matte Spray Sealer.

TECHNIQUE SHEET 161

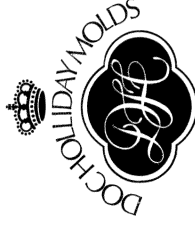
Doc Holliday Colors: DH-8 Black, DH-29 White, DH-19 Light Grey, DH-25 Toast, DH-30 Country Blue, DH-37 Cream, DH-9 Real Brown, DH-10 Mustard.

Step 1: Basecoat underside of bird and wings White. Apply a thin wash of Light Grey over the White, allowing color to stay in detail. Let dry. Drybrush "White" area with White. Shade upper chest and neck area with a thin wash of Toast. Shade between wing feather sections, tips of wings & tail and around prominent feathers with a Black wash. Paint markings on feathers, as in photo, with Black.

Step 2: Paint feet Mustard. Shade with a wash of Toast. Let dry, then drybrush with Mustard lightened with a little Cream. Paint nails Black.

Step 3: Basecoat all remaining areas with Black. Drybrush rocks with Light Grey. Tint them with washes of Toast, Country Blue, Real Brown and Black. Lightly drybrush rocks with Cream to highlight and blend colors.

Step 4: Drybrush upper body, head and upper wings of bird with Real Brown. Add Country Blue to same brush and drybrush area again to give feathers lue tint. Add Cream to same brush and drybrush edges of each feather with the lighter color. Paint dark bars on feathers with a Black wash. Lighten forehead with a heavy Cream wash. Drybrush beak Mustard; add Cream to same brush and highlight beak, especially on the tip. Shade around base of beak with a wash of Toast, then a wash of Black. Paint eyes Mustard; flood with a wash of Toast to tint. Paint ring around eye Mustard. Paint pupil Black. Line around each feather with a fine line of Black.
Step 5: Spray with Matte Spray Sealer.
